

Bullying Prevention Workshop

According to LALA's Bullying Policy:

Bullying is defined as any severe or pervasive physical or verbal act or action, including communications made in writing or electronically. Bullying includes one or more acts committed by a student or group of students that may constitute as sexual harassment, hate violence, or creates an intimidating and/or hostile educational environment, directed toward one or more students that has or can be reasonably predicted to have the effect of one or more of the following:

- Placing a student in fear of harm to person or property.
- 2. Causing a detrimental effect on his or her physical or mental health.
- 3. Causing an interference with his or her academic performance.
- 4. Causing an interference with his or her ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or privileges provided by LALA.

Cyberbullying is an electronic act that includes the transmission of harassing communication, direct threats, or other harmful texts, sounds, or images on the Internet, social media, or other technologies using a telephone, computer, or any wireless communication device. Cyberbullying also includes breaking into another person's electronic account and assuming that person's identity in order to damage that person's reputation.


LALA HS's monthly assembly provides an opportunity to celebrate teachers, students, and staff. Student leadership plans games for the school community to continue building a positive school culture.














