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
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
School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).



This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Los Angeles Leadership Primary Academy expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Los Angeles Leadership Primary Academy is \$5,767,089.00, of which \$3,403,608.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$755,268.00 is other state funds, \$25,000.00 is local funds, and \$1,583,213.00 is federal funds. Of the \$1,583,213.00 in federal funds, \$423,306.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$3,403,608.00 in LCFF Funds, \$872,514.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to desribe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.


